Re:	2022 Legislative Session – Climate Change Legislation		

This legislative session, Oregon Department of Energy staff is again tracking legislation and budget items that are relevant to the Oregon Global Warming Commission and the recommendations made in the Commission's 2020 Report to the Legislature. Staff will share updated reports periodically during the 2022 legislative session, with a final staff report for the first Commission meeting after the legislative session ends in early March.
