Re:	End of 2023 session update on climate-related legislation

LEGISLATION

During the legislative session, Oregon Department of Energy staff tracked legislation and budget items relevant to the Oregon Global Warming Commission and the recommendations made in the Commission's Roadmap to 2030 report. ODOE staff has updated the list of climate-related bills from the earlier <u>March 16</u> and <u>May 4</u> memos, adding notes about each bill's status at the end of the legislative session. As of August 3, most bills that were passed by the Legislature have been signed by Governor Tina Kotek.

The Oregon Department of Energy has published a <u>2023 Legislative Session Report</u> that includes a brief overview of the session overall and summaries of many of the bills mentioned below, including the two bills referred to as the "Climate Package," House Bill 3409 and House Bill 3630. Several bills related to climate change were combined into these two bills, as noted in the table below. Please see the individual underlying bills for more in-depth information about the legislative history of the programs and policies in the Climate Package.

Bills with "EN" after the bill number were passed by both chambers, with the signing date noted for bills that have been signed by the Governor. Bills that were not adopted by the Legislature are shaded grey in the table below, with committee location noted for bills that were adopted by one or more committees and remained viable up to sine die because they had been referred to a committee not subject to deadlines (e.g., Rules). For some amended bills, the description in the Bill Summary has been changed by Legislative Counsel to reflect changes from the Introduced version; changed Bill Summaries have been underlined in the table below. As noted in the March 16 memo, ODOE staff have organized the bills using the recommendations outlined in the Roadmap report, as well as a "Miscellaneous" category for additional climate-related bills that did not clearly fit into one of the Roadmap recommendation categories, including bills relating to climate resilience. **Bills relevant to the Roadmap recommendations whether they advance the recommendations or not (e.g., repeal of an existing program) were included in the list.** Please see the <u>March 16 memo</u> for more information about the Roadmap recommendations.

BUDGET bills
