**Re:** Climate-related legislation in 2023 session

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### LEGISLATION

This legislative session, Oregon Department of Energy staff is tracking legislation and budget items that are relevant to the Oregon Global Warming Commission and the recommendations made in the Commission's forthcoming Roadmap report. ODOE staff will share updated reports periodically during the 2023 legislative session and after the close of the session.

This memo includes a list of legislation introduced **as of March 10<sup>th</sup>**. ODOE staff have organized the bills using the recommendations outlined in the Roadmap report. The roadmap recommendations include six overarching strategies. Each of the recommended strategies include several sub-recommendations, but for ease of tracking and review, the bills are organized by the six overarching strategies:

1. Support robust and continuous implementation of existing climate programs and regulations.
2. Adopt updated state greenhouse gas goals consistent with the best available science.

3. Advance a set of additional climate actions – the TIGHGER Actions – that can help Oregon meet an accelerated greenhouse gas emission reduction goal of 45 percent below 1990 levels by 2030.<sup>1</sup>
4. Support further study and analysis to continue to guide effective climate action over time.
5. Strengthen governance and accountability for Oregon climate action.
6. Position Oregon to take full advantage of federal investments in climate action.

**Bills relevant to the Roadmap recommendations whether they advance the recommendations or not (e.g., repeal of an existing program) were included in the list.**

The list also includes a “Miscellaneous” category for additional climate-related bills that did not clearly fit into one of the Roadmap recommendation categories, including bills relating to climate resilience.

## **BUDGET**

The Joint Ways and Means Subcommittee on Natural Resources is currently in the middle of public hearings on agency budgets and has either heard or scheduled testimony on the following agency budget bills so far:
